

- What you'll see is data from Jan 1, 2020 to June 11, 2025 I requested via Public Records Act request to the Board. By approximately the third week of July, I'd received the request. Specifically, I'd requested and paid for the Trainee Job Cards and Data Collection Workbooks for that time period.
- I'd received the equivalent of 16207 trainee-days worth of workbooks and 12004 individual job cards (appropriately redacted). There were 25 trainees represented during that time frame. Realize that, due to the date range, some trainees were just finishing their training at the beginning of my data, some were fully captured, and some are current trainees.
 - 4203 trainee days were non-job card days (days off, family, illness, study, test, etc.) spread among the 25 trainees.
 - I matched the job card data signed by the pilot and trainee (redacted) to what was submitted on the Data Tracking Workbooks of each trainee, myself included, and found 357 discrepancies among 24 trainees.
 - Note: Trainee Bunch is not represented in this data as the data I received was not reliable enough to be able to discern into anything usable, so that Trainee has been fully omitted in this, therefore there are 24 trainees worth of data.
- My work with scripts and algorithms identified about 1500 potential discrepancies of the 12004 jobs.
 - These I looked through by hand to ensure accuracy. I did not want a valid job recording to be listed as a discrepancy.
 - Only jobs performed on one day which were recorded as occurring on another were called discrepancies.
 - Note that the vast majority of the 1200 discarded potential discrepancies were jobs which spanned midnight and were properly recorded.

- Excluded from discrepancies are any job times recorded which were less than 30 minutes from midnight, unless egregiously recorded.
- Jobs with which the job card and workbook couldn't be matched (i.e., 7 days between job occurrence and recording) or no job card for workbook entry were also discarded.
